2017 Rates for Weddings

Ceremony Only:\$350

Prelude, Processionals, Intra-Ceremony Music, Recessional

Ceremony plus up to 1-1.5 hours Reception:\$500

Cocktail Hour or Dinner Music, add \$250 for percussionist

Ceremony plus 2+ hours Recption:.....\$600

Cocktail Hour and Dinner Music, or other conception, add \$250 for percussionist

Reception/Cocktail Hour Only:.....\$350

Up to Two Hours of Reception, add \$150 for percussionist

Rates Include:

- Ceremony Planning Meeting(s). For anyone living in Chicagoland, I am always happy to travel to a home with guitar to meet and discuss the ceremony vision. For those outside Chicagoland, these can happen via phone/Skype/Hangout. I enjoy the ceremony planning process, and pledge endless consultation to find the right music.
- Learning any requests for ceremony music. My goal is always to honor all requests, but if the volume exceeds the spirit of what is reasonably possible, I may need to adjust the rate accordingly.
- My pledge to participate in the Rehearsal unless I am simply otherwise booked at that time (weddings in the city of Chicago, only).

Additional Consideration:

- For weddings outside of Chicagoland, I may request additional money for travel expenses.
- I am sometimes asked to contribute recorded music for Wedding Videos, or just as a keepsake. Pricing for this can vary greatly depending on the scope of the project, let me know if you may be interested in this and I am sure we can work it out!
