Most services include vows, rings, prayers, reflections, sacred readings, music, a message, and a charge. The final elements, including combination and order, are jointly determined in the planning sessions with the couple. Planning usually includes a sharing session and e-mail communication before the wedding. Though planning sessions are ideally done in person but they can be carried out through phone, skype, and e-mail when necessary. The sessions explore background, family perspectives, exploration of common ground in values and interests, communication, temperament, and spiritual perspectives and commitments the couple brings to the marriage.

Payment for leadership ranges between \$75 and \$200. This is negotiable, depending on ability to pay, circumstances, specific needs, and planning time commitment.
