
Hi, I'm Kayla!

finding the right wedding photographer

Ok, I'm not gonna lie, I'm a little biased here.

But even if you don't hire me, I still want you to find a photographer who's going to do an amazing job of capturing your once-in-a-lifetime moments. You don't want to look back on your day in a few years and wish you'd spent the extra money to hire a quality photographer!



Things to look for:

- Sharp, in-focus images
- Good coloration images don't look yellow, blue, or any other weird, unnatural color
- Great shots of key moments father looking at the bride, "first look" between the bride and groom, etc.
- A full day wedding from start to finish
- Carefully selected and edited images(like these!)

Things to avoid like the plague:

- A portfolio of only "detail shots" it's easy to take pictures of things that sit still!
- Any weird effect on photos that looks straight off Instagram - a telltale sign of a newbie photographer
- Lots of images that are slanted or highly tilted - another newbie crutch
- The promise of receiving "all the images" from the entire wedding you could end up receiving thousands of photos, including the blurry, eyes-shut, otherwise sub-par images that a veteran photog would never give a client

engagement photo session planning tips

Engagement photo sessions are an important part of your wedding planning! They're a great way to get to know your photographer and vice versa!

With so many details to figure out, we'll help you break down the must-haves for your e-session!

What to wear

You want to look cute, but what should you wear? The best bet is to match, but not perfectly. Matchy-matchy (think 80s family portraits with matching denim jackets) can be pretty cheesy.

Try to pick one color and work that throughout your outfits. Pinterest is a great source for outfit inspirations!





Where to go

Pick locations that mean something special to you:

The park where he proposed? Definitely!
The riding stable where you had your first date? Heck yeah!
The parked car where you had your first kiss? Why not?

All of these things add unique meaning to your photos!

What to do with the photos

You're thinking, "Great, I have all these photos, now what?"

Engagement photos make awesome wedding decor! Add framed prints to your guest book table, festoon your reception tables in loose 4x6 prints, or make a cute photo slideshow to show your guests! The possibilities are endless! Don't forget that they will make great canvases in your home too!!!



how to plan your wedding day



What time of day is best for photos?

A lot of people think high noon is great for photos--lots of sunlight, right?

WRONG! Noon means the sun is high in the sky, and, unless we take shelter under a nice tree, you'll end up looking squinty with shadows under your eyes, nose, and everywhere else that is unflattering!

Pick one of the "golden hours" for your photos--one hour after sunrise or one hour before sunset. If neither of those times works, try to at least stay away from the middle of the day, or have a plan for outdoor photos to be done somewhere with ample shade!

If you are a first-time bride, I'm guessing you haven't planned a wedding before...

Good news--I have!

I can tell you exactly how long you should leave in your day for photos, what light is best for photos, and much more. Follow our guide on this page to plan your day to get the most out of the day you'll never forget!

How much time do I need for formals?

A good rule of thumb is to budget more time than you think you need. That way, if things go a little off-course or people are running late (I'm looking at you, groomsman who forgot his black socks at home!), you have plenty of time to get everything accomplished before the ceremony. If everything goes off without a hitch (which I will do everything in my power to make happen!), you end up with extra time to chillax before the ceremony!

Most brides opt for about 2-3 hours for formals (but add extra if you have a huge bridal party--7 or more bridesmaids/groomsmen). Leave 30-60 minutes before the ceremony as "relax time"--time to prepare yourself for the important stuff--getting married!

Where should I take my formals?

Outdoor is best--pretty trees, warm sunlight... what's not to like?

While churches and other ceremony venues are great, they can be pretty formal and don't lend themselves to the fun, cute photos we're known for!


Getting your custom wall art designed is as easy as 1-2-3!



Once you decide to go with us, here's what you should expect:

First Consultation

This is a casual, sit-down discussion (over coffee, usually, yum!) where I just get to know you better and learn more about your wedding day and what I can do to help make your day the BEST EVER!

Engagement Session

Engagement sessions are a part of your wedding package, we like to schedule this 4-6 months prior to your wedding date so that you have plenty of time to use these great images on Save the Dates or wedding invitations!

WEDDING DAY!

The big day--and we guarantee that it'll be a great one! We arrive early to set up our gear, scope out your venues, and get shots of all the important details you've slaved over. Then we spend the rest of the day following you around to catch those fleeting but incredible moments you never want to forget!

Contract Signing

This is the more business-y part, but I still try to make it a little fun! Basically, you sign an agreement and pay your retainer, and that books your date on my calendar! You are officially a Kayla Illies Photography client!

Wedding Day Pre-Consultation

About 30 days prior to your wedding, I will send out a wedding day questionairre for you to fill out and we will discuss your day in greater detail. I'll help you plan out your day and how much time we need to allow to get all the photos your heart desires!

Post-Wedding Ordering Session

Once your photos are ready (about 4-6 weeks after the big day), we'll meet again (coffee?) and show you all the amazing images we captured! We'll show you our great products and give you a chance to select some beautiful products!

frequently asked questions

Wedding planning can be confusing, and we expect you to have a lot of questions!

Here are some of our most commonly asked questions:

Describe your style.

My photographic style is very rustic. Growing up out in the country and my love for it is a huge reason why! I strive to capture who you are as a person as naturaly as possible!



Do you travel?

I LOVE to travel! No distance is too far! If your planning a destination wedding or would like me to travel to photograph your wedding, contact me directly for a custom quote.

How far out do you book weddings?

I book most weddings 9-18 months prior to the wedding date, but we also book weddings from anywhere between 1-9 months as well depending on availability or last minute openings. Our busiest months are from May — October, so I HIGHLY recommend reserving your date as soon as possible.

Can you hold the date for me?

We can hold your wedding date only with the paid retainer and a signed contract. We cannot hold a date without them. We accept bookings on a first come/first serve basis.

How much do most clients invest in their photography?

Most clients invest around \$2,500 – \$5,000 on their wedding photography and products.

We love what we see! How do we book?

Wonderful! Since you will be spending more time with your photographer than any other professional on your wedding day, it is VERY important that we meet first and get to know each other!
